A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO ALLOW FOR THE SALE OR DISPOSAL OF MUNICIPAL PROPERTY DETERMINED TO BE NO LONGER NEEDED FOR MUNICIPAL PURPOSES BY WAY OF INTERNET ADVERTISING AND AUCTION AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Whereas internet web sites devoted to the advertising and auction sale of municipal property are available to the City of Highland Heights at reasonable costs and it is the desire of the City of Highland Heights to maximize the base of potential customers; and

Whereas, occasionally the City of Highland Heights has municipal property that has been deemed excess and no longer needed for municipal purposes;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND HEIGHTS, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. The Mayor, or his designated City Official, is hereby authorized to sell by internet auction of the items listed in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein as well as any other items designated by the City of Highland Heights with a value of \$1,000.00 or more during the calendar year 2017. The listing of items shall contain a minimum bid price and any item can be removed from the internet auction should the minimum bid not be offered. The Director of Public Service or Mayor's designee is authorized to establish a bid period after which the highest and best bid that equals or exceeds the minimum bid price will be accepted.

The City of Highland Heights will use govdeals.com as its vehicle to conduct the auction. The bid shall be maintained on the internet auction for a minimum of fourteen (14) days.

Section 2. The Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution have been taken at open meetings of this Council; and that deliberations of this Council and of its committees, resulting in such formal action, took place in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all statutory requirements including the requirement of Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the City of Highland Heights for the further reason that the property needs to be listed and sold as soon as possible to avoid the potential for a decline in value. It shall therefore, take effect immediately upon passage by the affirmative vote of not less than five (5) members elected to Council and approval by the Mayor or otherwise at the earliest time allowed by law.
