New Business:

1. First Reading of Proposed Resolution 22-2023 declaring Pat Flowers, Inc. to be the lowest and best bidder for the striping of certain streets within the municipality, authorizing the Mayor to enter into a contract with said bidder not to exceed the sum of Twenty-Two Thousand, Four Hundred Forty-Five Dollars and Thirteen Cents (\$22,445.13), rejecting all other bids received and declaring an emergency.
